★ SOUTH AFRICA

[Rev. Douglas Wu] On November 11, 1998, Rev. Clarence Pi, the founder and Executive Director of CIM, was taken home by the Lord in Pretoria. Rev. Pi was a Christ-follower, willing to obey God's calling and offer himself as a living sacrifice, like Abraham, not always knowing where the Lord would lead but going in faith.

In 1986, Rev. Pi courageously abandoned his professional work to join the mission field. In 1988, Rev. and Mrs. Pi headed to Brazil to begin ministry to the second generation youth and young professionals. God in turn led them to found the Chinese seminary in Brazil. In 1992, CIM was founded with its motto, "Making a difference in world evangelization through Chinese Soon after, they began cross-cultural missionaries." gospel work in Uruguay as well as evangelization to the Chinese in Chile and Germany. In 1994, Rev. Pi went to South Africa for his first visit. During another trip to South Africa in 1995, God called him again to enter the mission field and their entire family moved there, becoming one of the pioneers of gospel work targeting the Chinese diaspora on that continent. In 1997, they founded Pretoria Evangelical Chinese Christian Church. In 1998, they actively contributed to the first Consultation on Chinese Missions in Africa meeting. There the leaders of Chinese, African, and Western missions organizations began a

dialogue aiming to fulfill the Great Commission. It also fostered the exchange of missions



experience between Chinese churches and the African churches.

The influence of Rev. Pi's obedience and faith extends to present day. The Brazil seminary has trained up many pastors and ministers and is continuing to disciple and train workers as well as to nurture missionaries. Chinese mission organizations and churches are sending missionaries to Africa because of this vision. Please continue to pray for the Chinese Diaspora and the ministry in South Africa as they work to expand God's kingdom.

[Dan Yeh, Principal, Happy Kids & Happy Teens] The entire community of teachers and students at Happy Kids celebrated the 15th anniversary of the ministry and the graduation of the kindergarten class on Oct 20. Close to 500 were in attendance.



We remember the one who gave birth to this ministry, our Heavenly Father. Fifteen years ago, Rev. Clarence Pi saw the needs of the Chinese of the next generation and called forth a group of God-loving believers to fulfill a dream. This was to "establish a Chinese school that uses biblical education as its foundation," a dream that was like a seed planted in the soil that began to take root. In June 1997 Happy Kids Family Ministry was established. For the past fifteen years, our Heavenly Father guarded and led the children. He continues to help us live out our faith but also the lesson of being dependent on Him. He grants us wisdom, peace, and blessings, allowing us to seek refuge in the arms of our Heavenly Father!

During the celebration, there was a tree on stage, with student standing as the main trunk. From the leaves come many lovely little faces, growing into nine different kinds of the Fruit of the Spirit. The children then slowly came down from the tree and sang songs while holding hands, joyful and innocent, bringing many revelations to everyone.



★ WEST AFRICA-GHANA

[CIM-Canada] In 2002, the board of directors of CIM, pastors and several believers affirmed CIM's vision and purpose in Vancouver, aiming to apply a cross-cultural missions strategy to bring the Gospel to all corners of the world. That was the beginning of CIM-Canada.



CIM-Canada and the local church established a good relationship, also forming a partnership with ECG (Evangelical Church of Ghana) in general matters as well as seminary education. Through this relationship, we were able to establish twenty-nine churches and six village schools. CIM-Canada has developed a Chinese church cross-cultural mission model, sending short term teams to assist the local churches, respecting their leadership, and promoting a healthy standard of living among those people.

We believe this model is also being effectively used in other areas in Africa. French-speaking Togo is a new mission field. Those from Chinese churches who can speak French or English can share the Gospel there. CIM-

Canada will also be sharing their experience in cross-cultural missions at the 2013 CCCOWE (Chinese Coordination Centre of World Evangelism) conference to be held in Accra, Ghana April 13 -16, 2013.
