Rev. Wu also traveled to the city of Fuqing and visited with families of church members in Pretoria, Rustenburg, and Middleburg.

Rev. Wu and Whitney safely arrived in the U.S. on February 28 for furlough and will stay till the end of March. Please remember Rev. Wu in your prayers as he will be preaching in seven services at five bay area churches, sharing in two fellowship groups at two more supporting churches, and meeting with CIM board to discuss some long-term planning. Pray that they will also have time to rest, to revive, and to refresh.



Praise God that Pastor Jimmy Kung, from Living Hope Community Church of Silicon Valley, has already been serving in all areas of ministry in Pretoria as well as Rustenburg for the month of February. Please pray for his going out and coming in, as there are times that he has to drive between Pretoria and Rustenburg, by himself, on a weekly basis in order to preach in three churches, hold Bible study classes, and visit brothers and sisters. On top of having to operate a manual shift vehicle and driving on the opposite side to the U.S. flow of traffic, road closures and blockages can appear with no advanced notice.



Because of the Chinese New Year, many sisters have gone back to China with their children until early and mid-March, leaving their husbands to man the stores by

themselves. As such, they are often too tired to meet for Bible studies after the shops are closed. Also, riots and the looting and robbing at Chinese-owned stores, in particular, have made the shop owners too frightened to venture out during weeknights. May the Lord grant them protection and give them peace.



West Africa

Rev. Isaac Quan, Associate Executive Director of CIM Canada, Rev. Philip Leung, and other coworkers and board members returned to Ghana in January. Throughout the entire trip, Rev. Daniel Gbande, the General Overseer of the Evangelical Church of Ghana served as their companion.



In Ghana, the team visited the three village schools CIM currently supports. Despite the very unfavorable conditions in which they work, most teachers were strongly motivated and committed in their teaching positions. The team also visited two newly planted, and adopted, churches. Brothers and sisters there were making strong appeals to send STM teams to help spread the good news of Christ in the regions.

In Togo, part of the team joined Pastor Matthieu Ayena, CIM Canada's Togo Ministry Director, to visit three ministry locations in his country. Togo has been known to have the highest percentage (51%) of traditional faith (animistic belief) worshippers in Africa. However, in this recent visit, the team was surprised to see the number and widespread of the mosques everywhere they went. It is very obvious that Islam has outperformed all other religions in the country. The team was affirmed, nonetheless, how CIM has been a great help and blessing to them through the labor and commitment of Pastor Matthieu in their ministries.

Happy Kids began their new semester on February 2. More and more students are enrolled. So far there seemed to be enough teachers. However, two of them have illnesses so can only work part-time. As a result, they may need new teachers in the future.

There are also many students enrolled in the Happy Teens ministry and they need more teachers. Unrest from Brazilians protesting against bus fare hikes, inflation, police brutality, and the ineffective government have brought riots, at times violent, on streets of Sao Paulo. As some parents are not picking up their kids on time after school, the teachers have unwillingly become vulnerable to being targeted by the protesters as the nights fall. Pray for the coworkers to have wisdom in partnering with parents in arriving at a cordial and pleasant situation.
