The historical background of this passage is when the people of Northern Kingdom emigrated to Southern Kingdom; their main purpose was to make sacrifice to Yehweh, the God of their fathers. Yet Douglas would like to turn this passage into his prayer: "All those, among God's chosen people, who are willing to obey the Great Commission, may offer themselves as missionaries in order to propagate the Gospel to the ends of the earth as a sacrifice to the Lord God of our



fathers! Come, Lord Jesus."

In late June Minister Ming-Ming Yang of Taipei Christian Yung He Church led a team of seven to Pretoria for short-term mission work. "How to Train Your Dragon," was the theme of our 2011 Student Youth Camp. A total of 43 participated, including eight students from Johannesburg Evangelical Covenant Church. This was also Chinese Christian Student Society at University of Pretoria, C2S2's first-time participation, seven of them went. When the short-term missionaries shared how God healed and saved them from their weaknesses, the Holy Spirit touched many hearts. At the last night, by the camp fire, seven students spoke of church as their "spiritual home"! Their words shocked both of us! We immediately repented before the Lord. (We thought only families have such feeling! We didn't realize that the university students also think the same way.) Therefore, we feel even more earnest to ask the Lord for His grace, so that we may gain wisdom in taking good care of "God's home."

Six students have decided to receive Jesus as Lord and Savior! Moreover, twelve students indicated that they want Jesus' immeasurable grace to transform their lives. This is indeed God's grace and the fruit of the short-term mission team.

For 16 years, Douglas' liver indices were GOT104, GPT117(AST, ALT) which exceeded 3 times the upper limit of normal index 34. But last month's test showed that his liver index has gone down to 30, 34. He again experienced His God as Alpha. Alleluia!

The transportation department plans to collect tolls in the near future from motor vehicles traveling between Johannesburg to Pretoria. 50Km one-way rate is R33. By then, all prices will go up even higher.
- 3. Please pray for the family retreat at the end of this year. Brothers and sisters of Chicago New Light Christian Church and Rev. Wenhui Gong, a total of 8, will come and lead the Retreat. May the Lord bless our work in recruitment.
- 4. PECCC and Rustenburg Fu-qing Fellowship plan to register with the government as official churches (non-profit organizations). May the Lord open the way, and the registration process may be pleasing to Him.
