When I studied at CDTS, I distinctly remembered one day in 2002, the Holy Spirit convicted me that "Jesus is Messiah" through a Bible Holy Land class. Later on in the seminary, I experienced Job 4:15-16 "A spirit glided past my face and the hair on my body stood on end. It stopped but I could not tell what it was. A form stood before my eyes, and I heard a hushed voice:" when I prayed. Even though I was scared to death and wished to flee from the room, I knew He is Jehovah Shalom. May we experience once again God's amazing will be done because "the blessing of the Lord brings wealth, without painful toil for it" (Proverbs 10:22)

Since last December, e-tolling system is in place in Gauteng, the province where we live. However, 60% of the residents' cars (about 1,500,000 vehicles) are not registered for E-Tag. Complaints are rampant, but the government has not responded..... Recently there are heavy rains in South Africa. No one comes to fix the malfunctioned traffic lights or direct congested traffic. I admire South Africans' patience, they would wait for their turn to cross intersections as if there were four-way-stops.

An immigration officer confiscated Brother Chen and his wife's passports while he randomly marked "no documentation" on their PR documents. So the couple filed claims at the immigration office, but the bureau issued no PR replacements even though they were very sympathetic to their case. Not only so, the officer demanded further for 3,000 Rand before he can return the passports! Brother Chen asked me to teach him how to pray for this matter.....!

Gold and platinum miners continue to strike. South African currency exchange rate keeps declining to 1US\$: R11.25. When the inflation is soaring, the Government announced without much thoughts that gasoline price will rise to R14.03 per liter. Protests and riots broke out in nearby Bronkhorstspruit city and East London due to crashing utility bill paying system. These events are all related to people's livelihood. We are expecting similar unrest till general election in May.

Just before I send this prayer letter we received the following correspondence. With author's permission, I'd like to share with you for the furthering of the mission work. May God's faithfulness be praised!

Dear Douglas and Whitney, Shalom:

I am a brother from Keelong Chidu Devoted Faith Church. Do you remember me? When you were attending Christ Disciples Training Seminary you interned at our Paul Fellowship for a year. At the time, I was serving in the military, therefore we didn't cross path as much, but I remembered how you served us. You used to say that I looked like Keanu Charles Reeves. Do you remember me by now? That's okay, the point is.....I switched to Torch Covenant Church years ago. I'm taking an equipping class and reading Hudson Taylor's biography. The contents of the book touched me deeply. This missionary had given his whole life for the Chinese. His life also prompted me to think of you and your ministries in South Africa. Thank you for sending us your prayer letters, so that we may know what's going on over there. When I was a student, your picture often appeared in my mind because of your letter and the things you do. These letters are like a South African edition of Hudson's biography, they touched me greatly. I realize that besides missionaries serving on the front line, supporters are just as important. My vision and calling is to be a "monitory missionary." That's why I am writing, first, to send my greetings; second, to tell you how God has moved me through the book to support missionaries financially. I don't earn very much, thus only a small amount of offering. Please keep sending me your prayer letters, so that I may pray for you more as while I give monetarily.
