The daughter-in-law of Mrs. Mai is an unbeliever and the twin she was carrying had a premature birth at seven months. Doctors were not able to save the baby girl during birth, and the baby boy also died after a month's struggle in the incubator. But thankfully the mother was fine.

Sister XiaoXing had a major operation last year which was a combination of three different procedures for ectopic pregnancy, gall stones, and removal of gall bladder. At the beginning of this year she was happy to find out she was pregnant for the second time, but she also miscarried by end of January.

Sister Xue gave up her daughter Maria at birth to be raised by a white woman, and Maria is now five years old. This white woman doesn't want to return Maria and took legal action to apply for consent by birth parents for child to travel overseas. Actually she wanted to use this legal action to enter a child custody suit. Because Sister Xue and her husband don't understand English, the white woman was able to accomplish her goal of the past one plus years and will enter formal court proceedings on February 2nd to keep the child and not return her to Sister Xue.

Brother Chen returned to China for a proctologic surgery, so his two lovely children YuXuan and LongEn stayed with us for two weeks. It brought us back to the time when Helen and Clarence were in elementary school.

Clarence's grades from last year (11th grade) were not very good so he couldn't apply for college admission last April. He had to wait for the Matric test scores from last year to be released and apply this April for college admission in 2018. In mid-January he received his Matric scores, which improved a lot but the math score wasn't ideal. In chemistry he only received a score of 49.5 which dimmed his plan to apply for dentistry and Bachelor of Science in Biology. This was a major blow for him (and actually for me and Whitney as well). Clarence's first reaction was to apply for a regrading of his tests. The office of the Department of Education is located in the Pretoria Central Business District. Because of the situation with crime and traffic, both of us were under great stress when we made the trip. I waited for him in a parking structure two blocks away, and he said there were a lot of people waiting in line. I used WhatsApp to pray with him. An hour later he said he was done, because he ran into a friend who told him the people waiting in line were there to apply for tuition reductions or waivers, and he could go upstairs directly and avoid a long wait time. He hoped to get at least 50 points for his chemistry score then he could apply for the Bachelor of Science in Biology. Psalm 37:5 "Commit your ways to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this." Clarence also said his friend told him he could apply to retest two subjects, but he needs a letter from a company stating he would be considered for employment if he scores at least 60 points in both subjects. I therefore suggested him to intern in Dr. Huang's Chinese medicine clinic this year and ask Dr. Huang to help with the letter. (My older sister also has a company, but Clarence is not familiar with the works of that company and Dr. Huang is also a Christian brother.) Clarence happily went back to apply for the retest, but an interview was required this time to find out his understanding of the potential job (maybe to weed out fake applications?) Clarence recounted to me the wonders of God's work: With his experience of acupuncture through a Sister Debbie from a Short Term Mission team, who was also a Chinese medicine doctor, and the memory of visitations to Chinese medicine shops with me, he was able to pass the interview (He was the only one to pass that day) and planned for four days to retest at end of February or beginning of March.
