Prayer Requests

1. Give thanks to the much support from brothers and sisters in prayer and in finances with the medical treatment of Rev. Wu's Hepatitis C virus.
2. Praise the Lord for bringing Pastor Jimmy Kung to serve in South Africa for two months, allowing Rev. and Mrs. Wu to successfully and blessedly finish their furlough. Much thanks also go out to brother Chan and his wife in hosting Ps. Kung in Rustenburg for that period of time. May the Lord pour blessings on them.
3. Please pray for Sharon, the eldest daughter of Rev. and Mrs. Wu, as she needs to apply for her graduate study in Psychology either in Taiwan or the U.S. May the Lord pour down His anointing oil on her.
4. Pray for God's providence for willing and suitable team members, suitable campsites, timeframes and locations for the July and end of Dec. retreat in South Africa.
5. Pray for the government of South Africa. The policy of taking turn in power brownouts has not been resolved and yet there'll be another jump in energy prices of about 12%. In addition, the price of oil, with added taxes, has risen to US\$1.05 per liter. Only with the reduction of the ANC (African National Congress, the country's governing social democratic political) party's power will there be checks and balances.
6. The power brownouts policy has affected the economy (with foreign divestiture), society stability (rising unemployment rate, the inefficiency of government offices operation), health services, transportation, etc. Please intercede and hope that the government can quickly solve this problem of energy shortages.
7. Let us lift up the training sessions for the two Brazil STM teams that will begin in May. Pray also for the brothers and sisters in Brazil to prepare their hearts and minds for the arrival of the teams.
8. Prayers for the church in Curitiba, Brazil—Intercede for the brothers and sisters to put their dedication for Bible study and other ministries into practice; ask the Lord to grant them favor so they may have a heart to learn and to know Him more; for the church to try expanding through cell groups; and also that the extension of their ministries will be according to God's will.
9. Pray for the brothers and sisters in Salvador, Brazil, to take more opportunity to read the Bible and to learn how to seek the Lord.
10. Ask the Lord to raise up French-speaking coworkers to join in the ministries in Togo.
11. Please intercede for the villages that have been affected by the Ebola virus and for our coworkers in Ghana, asking for wisdom, love, and strength that can only come from Christ.
12. There is urgent and immediate need in the mission fields among the Chinese in South Africa and Brazil. Pray earnestly for the God of harvest to send forth His workers to reap the harvest.
13. Ask the Lord to abundantly provide the financial needs of CIM's various departments.
14. Continue to lift up Mrs. Christine Pi for her overall health and for safety in all her going out and coming in.
