Focus of Missions

Faith—When God used the late Rev. Clarence Pi as His vessel to call me to ministry, I did not know English, had only a high school diploma, without support from my mother church. What I had was faith. After studying four years of study at the seminary, I applied and was accepted as a missionary with the CIM, Chinese International Missions. By faith, our family has served God for thirteen years without lacking anything! He even completely healed me from my Hepatitis B, C, and D.

As said in Hebrews 11:1, “Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.” And then in verse 6, “And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him.”

We came to the PECCC (Pretoria Evangelical Chinese Christian Church) in 2004 and God subsequently lead us to

establish the PFECC (Pretoria Fu-Qing Evangelical Chinese Church) as well as the RFECC (Rustenburg Fu-Qing Evangelical Chinese Church). By faith, God allowed us to experience His power and His promise!

Hope—Hope is the life that God gave the dead. Our God is the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not. There are approximately three hundred thousand Chinese, of which one-third of them are Fu-Qing, in South Africa. Most of them are of the grass-root variety and only has a middle-school education. But after they accepted Jesus, His word transformed their lives, helped them to stop smoking, drinking, gambling, and follow His word. Even though they still do not have a habit of reading, they do attend service regularly and thirst for His word, allowing others to witness His love that fills their lives and their daily living. The

same love from our Lord that rescued me and transformed me also rescued them and transformed them. Our Lord’s love and the Good News must reach the ends of the earth.

Love—I would like to tell my story: I met Jesus and accepted Jesus in South Africa and that’s where the Holy Spirit revived me! South Africa was also where I met my wife and where she bore me our children to build up this spiritual family! Perhaps you can call this country my spiritual home and therefore I must share His Good News in South Africa. But to tell you the truth, the reason I can claim this power, glory and grace to serve God is all because He loves me and He dies for me! Because of His love, I have a new life. So no matter where He will lead me in the future, I will say, “Here I am, Lord. Send me.”

It is my sincere hope that you can also experience God’s love, accept His hope, and with faith to experience His power.

13. Pray for the various ministries in Ghana and Togo of West Africa. Ask the Lord to raise up more brothers and sisters to join in STM trips and support the ministry.
14. CIM will be preparing for our 25th Thanksgiving gathering. Please ask that the Lord will prepare and bless us to smoothly arrange everything according to His will.
15. Ask God to bless coworkers on the home front with wisdom; that they will offer their best to accomplish what the Lord has bestowed upon us.
16. Ask the Lord to provide abundantly in all areas of CIM's ministry.

learn God's almighty plan in South Africa, a place that I don't think I would have gone if it's not this STM trip.

Throughout this trip, I am so glad that I can be part of the team in serving the people in South Africa.

God not only loves people in the U.S., but also loves the Chinese people in South Africa!
