# South Africa

Mission in action: we are a blessing and are blessed in return.

This is the second mission trip for the PECCC youth fellowship to Durban, South Africa during their Easter



break (April 6-10). We thank God for the opportunity and that the youth are willing to participate. Through their experience they realized that they have been blessed each time they are willing to serve. Indeed God gives strength and blesses those who obey his

command. They stayed with Pastor Eugene in Durban again and working alongside the church leaders in serving three locations, namely the Mother of Peace orphanage, the Illovo



church in Amanzimtoti and the township community of Kwamakuthu. The theme of the program was 'my family in Christ' and through worship, storytelling, skits, games, and prayer, the youth testified about the love of God. A total of 108

children from age 13-18 attended the five day cross cultural mission. Through this encounter the youth have

developed a deeper understanding of the commission great God has commanded, which thev shared with their home church afterward. Also, we that through pray messages their during this five-day encounter,

## Brazil

We will be going to four different cities working among local churches to train church leaders and youth and also to conduct a teachers' retreat. In two cities we will be working alongside the Sao Paulo medical team to spread the gospel to new immigrants through free clinics. Members from three churches from northern and southern California will be participating in this year's adventure. Please pray for smooth training and learning sessions before we leave for Brazil. We will have three sessions in May and two in June. The first team will serve from July 7 – 21 while the second group is from 17-31.

Please pray for our teams as we are preparing for the trip. There have been 'attacks', such as health issues, opposition from family members and from work. As we embark on our mission journey this year we are sure that the Lord is with us and that he is the one who goes before us and will prepare the way so we shall not be afraid.

It is a general phenomenon that most of the newly converted Chinese Christians, like other Chinese in Brazil, are intent on making as much money as they can and often lack the desire to pursue spiritual growth. We hope that church coworkers will be able to guide these young Christians and to help them mature. This is also one of our goals, that through short term missions we can partner with the local churches to help believers in the eagerness to study the Bible and to learn more about God.

We will be conducting a youth retreat at the Belo Horizonte church; there are already 12 believers enrolled. We hope and pray that more youth, in particular non-believers, can join us in this special program that is catered to them. Please pray that parents of these youth will allow them to participate in the three day event and be willing to free the youth from manning the shops. We pray that through spiritual growth and maturity these believers will develop a new worldview where the Lord is the most important aspect of their lives. It is our hope that through the two-week encounter they have with the team this summer will lead to transformed lives as they grow in the knowledge of the love that God has showered upon them and the riches he blesses them with.

Dear partners even though we are unworthy and have limited abilities, we are convinced that nothing is impossible with God. We are greatly in need of your intercession now, before we leave for the short-term mission trip to Brazil. Pray for a successful training and learning time. Do not wait until we are there in July - now is the time for prayer. Please earnestly pray for the short term mission teams and the people who we are going to serve there as well.

### West Africa

The media has created a tremendous deal out of the Ebola epidemic situation in West Africa and people fear to go. Leung, executive director of Canada, was leading a team in January this year and confirmed that both Ghana and Togo are not infected with Ebola, and as a matter of fact, that the two countries where we are serving are 500 miles away from those affected countries.
