They have been learning about sharing of the Gospel cross-culturally and serving in different cities. They have also served in their home church—leading worship, teaching children's Sunday school classes, and being involved any way they can.

At the Pretoria FuQing Church, couples are bringing

their children to the gatherings. At times there are three generations in a family who worship together. Seeing their unity, we truly give thanks to God. Even with the power outages at night, Bible study classes did not discontinue. The congregation hopes to learn



more of God's word, striving to get to know Him. After the years of equipping from Rev. Douglas Wu, we can only give the glory back to God when we see the transformation in their lives.

God answered the prayers of the church in Rustenburg—three people signed up for the baptism class. Another breakthrough is also taking place in the coworkers' training class where ten brothers and sisters are willing to learn the "Character of Christ's Servants" together. They continue to move forward and grow.

In addition, language barrier will be another challenge. Even though most of the young people understand Mandarin and English, some can only communicate in Portuguese. to plan an appropriate program to teach the Gospel Truth and offer salvation to the non-believing young friends they invite to the camp. Jehovah Jireh! - 6. Happy Kids and Happy Teens' two-day teachers' retreat, that God will revive the hearts of the teachers and allow them serve the Lord without feeling fearful or weary.
- 7. The STM team as they lead the youth retreat in Belo Horizonte. Pray for the youth who will be attending the event, that their young lives will completely be won over to the Lord.
- 8. There is a drought in Brazil and it is a very serious matter affecting the economy and causing the unemployment rate to increase. Many Chinese there operate their own businesses, such the restaurant industry, gas stations, car washes, and beauty parlors that require a lot of water and so face the risk of closing their businesses. May the Lord care for them and grant special grace on them.
- 9. Ask that God will grant the coworkers on the home front wisdom so that even as the ministry work increases, complications do not. Ask the Lord to instill a peaceful spirit, being open to the Lord's teaching with one heart, allowing the coworkers to fulfill their responsibility before the Lord and to complete the work that's bestowed by Him.
