- 10. Pray to the Lord to grant abundant providence to CIM's financial needs in the coming year.
- 11. Ask the Lord to add coworkers to serve jointly at CIM.
- 12. Pray for Mrs. Christine Pi's eyes be healed and that she will have good health.
