This year's carnival in Brazil is from the evening of February 18th to noon of February 22nd. During the carnival, there are not only parades of different floats, but also many people dancing on the streets all day long. Generally, churches use this period of time to hold devotional camps, because during this period, stores will not be open, including those in the Shopping Center, and because of COVID 19, many people have been closed in for the past two years. But now they are basically open, and Brazilians like to celebrate by nature. So, the mayors of many big cities encourage dancing on the streets of the city, and the city government even put some barricades to isolate the main thoroughfare to let the people dance to their heart's content without being disturbed.

The Belo Horizonte Chinese Church originally wanted to use this time to hold some gospel-related activities, but most of the members have traveled abroad, and the street of the Baptist Church, which was borrowed for Sunday worship, was also isolated for dancing, so, the church will not be open during this period. Because of this, the Sunday worship was held at the home of Brother Lin Zhenzong. Mr. Ji has two sons and a daughter. The eldest son is 15 years old, named Vitor, and he is very good at the game. When we were about to have lunch after playing golf, Mrs. Luo was talking to Vitor in the living room. As a result, Mrs. Luo realized that although he was young, he was a bit under pressure in life, so she shared the gospel with him. Finally, he accepted Jesus as his Savior. Right then, we gathered around and held hands, and I prayed for him for his decision. Thank the Lord and all glory to Him. Although there were not many people attending the trip to the Belo Church, we firmly believe that God's will is higher than man's will. God has chosen Vitor Ji and will use the wonderful friendship between brother Lin and Mr. Ji and the wonderful life testimonies of the members of the church for our newfound friend to be brought before the mercy seat of the Lord.
