Do You See the Needs of the Chinese People in the Southern Hemisphere?

Matthew 4:23 "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. ²⁴ News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed; and he healed them. ²⁵ Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed him."

"Jesus went throughout Galilee...and his fame spread throughout Syria." Galilee is one of the three areas surrounding the Sea of Galilee. According to the contemporary historian Josephus, it is estimated that there are about 204 towns and more than 3 million residents; and Syria most likely refers to the area in Galilee. Next to it, the Aram region of the Old Testament, around Damascus. If the Lord Jesus went to one town every day, it would have taken Him more than half a year to travel throughout Galilee and spread His fame throughout Syria. This is the starting point of missionary work of the Lord Jesus. This passage means that He worked tirelessly to travel throughout this land to preach to the people He met.

There are many more ways for missionaries to reach people today than there were for the Lord Jesus. Since the global pandemic, the Internet has provided an effective platform to reach people of all ages, classes, regions, and time zones. On the one hand, the Internet platform is an effective channel to care for newcomers. On the other hand, whether in South Africa or Brazil, in the past seventy years or so, there have been second and third generations of Chinese immigrants from Hong Kong, Taiwan, and mainland China. Most of them will still be proud of their Chinese roots. By using the Internet platform and using appropriate communication methods to find them, the gospel will be able to exert its power to "save everyone who believes." Missionaries of the Chinese International Mission ("CIM" for short) have also tried to use the Internet to break out of the comfort zone they were familiar with in the past. However, with limited time and energy, they greatly need the help of more colleagues.

South Africa and Brazil are two mission fields of CIM and two important missionary points for Chinese people. Both countries are listed among the "BRICS" countries that have close relations with China. Under the recent adjustment of China's international relations, the destinations of Chinese people leaving the country may have changed somewhat, but South Africa and Brazil will remain the areas that Chinese people may choose for trade, small business, exchanges, and study abroad. These two countries are still the countries in the Southern Hemisphere with the largest concentration of Chinese people. They are even home to more than half of the Chinese diaspora in the Southern Hemisphere. The total number of Chinese people may exceed 800,000, no less than those in the Bay Area, Los Angeles, or New York. The number of Chinese in the Chinese areas shows that these two countries are strategic areas outside China for free preaching to the Chinese.

Will you follow the example of the Lord Jesus who worked tirelessly? Do you see the need in the Southern Hemisphere? The Chinese in South America and South Africa need someone to preach the gospel of the kingdom to them. Are you moved to become a missionary there? CIM has been called by the Lord to work with other missions organizations in these two areas in missionary work to bring these unreached people before the Lord. If you see this need, please pray with us, and actively participate in this missionary work.
