My Experience of Youth Camp 2013

When I wanted to go to this camp I was not sure what to expect from it, only that I went every year for 6 years and I enjoyed it in the past. Then we were asked to write down what we wanted to gain from this camp and I wrote that I wanted to get to know God more.

Chiara, a cousin of the Wu siblings, was a character I learnt about the most in this camp. Before this camp she had been attending our church for roughly 3 months due to her living with the Wu family but even though she had been with us for so long I had not found a way to interact with her. We were in the same group and as all members of the group share their life stories and experience as well as getting to know each other, I got to know her as a person.

From this I learnt that communicating with people is not as difficult as we ought to think. God also speaks to us in ways that we never expect.

Last of all, every year during this camp I learn to speak a lot more Chinese, especially this year!
