In the blink of an eye, 2018 has come to an end. We joined CIM at the end of 2017,


sharing our personal testimony, mission vision and ministry needs at churches in USA and Taiwan. In retrospect, it seems like yesterday. We talked about God's call, our struggle and fear and God's grace in our lives at that time. Today, God leads us to spread the Good News to the Chinese people in South Africa.

In the past year in South Africa, searching for God's guidance is a daily task. Sometimes I ponder, "Lord! Why don't You just appear in front of us and tell us what You want us to do and which person to draw to You?" We then can concentrate with the limited resources. However, God never did. He does show up in our visits to fellow believers, in our interaction with seekers, in our com-



mute, in prayers, in the people around us, in all those agonies, in simple satisfaction, and

even in those angry or unpeaceful gazes. I see God's mercy as he transforms us into the person God wants for Himself. Despite our frustration, weakness, sadness, tears, failure and self-condemnation, we are comforted and restored by God. To new missionaries like us, the lessons learned are necessary and precious. which was established during early years of CIM. Our ministry of shepherding includes weekday Bible study, young adult and senior fellowships. We try to outreach to local Chinese people with the gospel, especially at colleges and middle schools, through soccer and basketball activities, to get to know those unbelievers. There are many young families. We pray for a gospel group composed of young families. We are trying to form a deeper relationship with them through church activities invitation, family picnic and visits, so we can become their friends in life. Some of them have other beliefs, some reject Christianity, some are not interested in religion. Even so, we still see God at work as some have accepted our invitation to church activities, although they rejected us before. This change took a year. Pray that God will continue working in their hearts to accomplish His will in His time.

January this year, our older son Samuel (9 years old) will start 3rd grade and younger daughter Isaaca (4 years old) her 2nd year of preschool. They have adjusted to school life here. Samuel was bullied when he first started. Now it is getting better. I believe this is a precious lesson for him growing up. He has formed friendship in class now. Samuel and Isaaca have different personalities. Once we talked about heaven and I told them heaven is a beautiful place. All believers will go there one day. Mom will go there, too.



Samuel was sad after that and said, "I don't want you to leave me." However, Isaaca claimed nervously, "Ah! Who's gonna cook for me!" We thank God all the time for these


PRAYER REQUESTS

- 8. Pray for the Youth Fellowship of the Belo Horizonte church. May Lord keep the young brothers and sisters so they will persevere in studying Bible and attending the fellowship. Ask the Lord to also provide a coworker to lead them.
- 9. May the Lord bless the pastor and elders of the Porto Alegre church in leading the brothers and sisters to know God better and learning to serve.
- 10. Pray for God's blessing and the health of the body, heart, and soul of the coworkers in Campinas church as they learn how to spread the gospel.
- 11. Pray for CIM Canada's cross cultural ministry and ask God to call for more brothers and sisters to participate in various ministries at Ghana, Togo, and Ukraine.
- 12. Ask the Lord to bless CIM coworkers with wisdom and to serve faithfully, so that we can accomplish what the Lord has bestowed upon us. Pray for the Lord to add more brothers and sisters to participate in the ministry.
- 13. Pray for God to provide abundantly for the financial needs of CIM.
