So What's Good about STM Trips?

CIM has been leading those who have answered and shown obedience to God's call to go on STM (Short-Term Missions) trips for many years now. You might have wondered and considered, "Is it worth the time and money to go?" "Let the people who are holier, more experienced, more qualified go." or "Aren't these trips for the pastors and missions department staff?"

God Calls People Through STM's—There are some amazing things that can take

place in the lives of the people on the trips and in the lives of those they touch. The majority of (longterm) missionaries were either called to missions because of a STM trip, or that God used such a trip to solidify their call or give further direction. There is no denying that seeing the field first-hand can have a big impact on a person's life.

STM trips Can Raise Supporters—Those who have seen the fields are more likely to become faithful supporters of missionaries and the



mission fields. They will have a better idea of how to pray. Those who went with a STM team have seen some of the difficulties that missionaries and nationals experience on the field. These people also have a greater desire to financially support the mission outreach of their church. The visitor has a chance to see that even just \$100 can help the missionary and nationals obtain more resource materials.

STM's Lead to a Greater Burden To Share The Gospel—Sometimes people think that being on the mission field will help a person become a better witness for the Lord. Now maybe if you are not a good witness at home, you probably won't be on the field either. However, a STM trip can help instill boldness in someone to share their faith because of being around like-minded Christians. Many times they will go home excited about what they saw the Lord do on the field and then carry that burden to share the Gospel with their friends and family that they may have never witnessed to before.

Large Projects Can Be Completed by STM Teams—Sometimes a project requires many man-hours to accomplish. A STM team can come in and do in a week what would take the missionary months or years to complete. There are many projects, such as hosting training sessions for the national leaders or putting up an evangelism gathering, that can perhaps be accomplished or greatly advanced with a STM group. There is something to be said for having a group of people dedicated and focused on a solitary task.

STM's Encourage The Missionary—Missionaries may be starved for Christian fellowship. They are almost certainly starved for people to speak English with and be able to tell a joke and have people laugh. This may also be the only time every year that the missionary and his family get things brought to them on the field. When a team visits it is like Christmas for the missionaries.

A missionary once said that we would never fully understand what life is like on the mission field as long as we are holding a return-trip plane ticket in our hands. How true that is. Many times people will go on a STM trip and feel like they understand the culture and hardships that the missionary faces, when they really get is a glorified view of the mission field. It is possible for a person to think that the types of activities that the team did is what life on the field is like all the time. What they don't see is the missionary standing in line for five hours trying to get his license plate renewed. That the missionary's wife spends two full days of the week running around town trying to get enough groceries for the family. The STM team member does not know about the 2 o'clock in the morning knocks on the door asking the missionary to come comfort a

One thing we do have to be careful when we go on STM's is to not have the arrogance to think that the team's way of life is the only way to do things. See, we may not see ourselves as rich, but if we have more than two shirts or more than one pair of shoes, we are rich in the eyes of the national. We show up on the field with a camera, an i-Phone, new jeans, sunglasses worth more than many people make in a month and then we try to convince them we are *not* rich. That just won't cut it.

Now the truth is, when we go to serve others, we will always be blessed by receiving more than we give (Acts 20:35). The trip will be memorable because of the unexpected ways God worked in the team member's lives. Above all, serve God by serving others without a "what's in it for me" attitude and focus only on where God leads us. Then Lord willing, everyone will be blessed.
