Reflection on serving at the Brazil Beauty Chinese Baptist Church (Part 1)

I am so grateful! After graduating from seminary in March last year, Rev Jorge Luo Jiadong invited me to visit the Belo Horizonte Chinese Baptist Church (abbreviated as "Belo Church") in Belo City, Minas State in December. In early January this year, Rev Luo, his wife and Minister Ye Dan invited me to serve in Belo Church. Rev Luo earnestly admonished me to be humble and urged me to trust in the Lord with all my heart. Thank the Lord! On January 10th, I officially started serving at Belo Church.

While in seminary, I expressed my hope that the Lord would arrange for me to serve in a small church. I never expected that what I had thought and wished for would be fulfilled by the grace of the Lord today. Thank the Lord! I firmly agreed to go not because I was rather pleased and thought I was capable of serving. On the contrary, I was happy but also worried. I was worried that I was a rookie, my life was not mature enough, and I lacked pastoral experience. I was worried whether I could serve in a place where I was unfamiliar with the place. I was worried whether the brothers and sisters in the church trust me. The only thing that gave me confidence was my belief in the Lord's promise and faithfulness, as well as Rev Luo's support and guidance. Later, I found that some of my worries were unnecessary, because the Lord not only prepared a place for me to serve Him, but also prepared sufficient grace for me to serve. Just as the Bible says, "My grace is sufficient for you." The following is a brief record of my experiences over the past two months.

(I) The loving reception from the brothers and sisters was like old friends at first sight.

On the first day of my service at Belo Church, I arrived in Belo at 8 a.m. Before I even left the station, I first received a call from Rev Luo. Then my co-worker sister Wei Miao arranged for her husband, brother Zhou Guanping, who had just believed in the Lord a month ago, to pick me up and take me to his store to rest. He also prepared breakfast for me, booked a hotel room, and kindly invited me to have lunch with him. He also said that he would be responsible for picking me up and dropping me off at church on Sundays in the future. Brother Zhou is an upright, talkative person who cares about the church's work. In the afternoon, he took the initiative to take me to visit Brother Ji Junqun, who had also just converted to Christianity. He then arranged for me to meet my co-worker Brother Xing at his restaurant after closing time. Brother Xing is an old Christian from China. He was happy to see me, and in addition to hosting a dinner reception, he also invited me to have lunch and dinner at his restaurant every day. Another co-worker, Brother Wen Xingke, contacted me via WeChat and gave me his blessings. Sister Guiying also called me on WeChat to welcome me and my family and sent them her blessings. In the second week, I was taken care of by the local Baptist church and moved into one of its single unit house. Brother Zhou drove to bring me a quilt that night. Thank the Lord!

(II) Role models for church coworkers.

Chinese who open shops or work in shopping malls in Belo generally have a hard time. They have to open their shops every day, from 8 am to 8 pm. They cannot open the shops too early or close too late, otherwise they will be fined heavily. Apart from two or three days off during Carnival, there is almost no rest throughout the year. In such a business and working environment, the willingness of many believers and seekers to attend Sunday worship and midweek online gatherings has been greatly affected and restricted.

Belo Church has a history of nearly 30 years, but the number of attendees has not increased significantly. It has long relied on the Brazilian Baptist Church to provide venues on Sundays, and there is no venue available for the church to use freely during the week. Has the Lord ever left this little church? No.

A small group of church coworkers are the living witnesses of the Lord. They are a small group protected by the Lord through His faithful servant Rev Luo. They all consciously and joyfully insist on attending online gatherings three times a week and attending the Sunday worship in person. They and most of the brothers and sisters respect the preachers, and the glory of the Gospel can be seen from the interactions in their church-body lives.
